



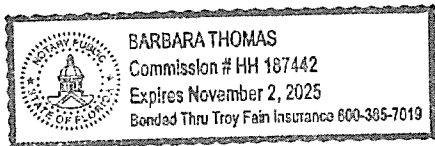

SPECIAL BOARD MEETING & PUBLIC HEARING
MAY 31, 2023**

A. CALL TO ORDER

District Manager Nancy Nguyen called the May 31, 2023, Special Board Meeting of the Venetian Parc Community Development District (the “District”) to order at approximately 6:54 p.m. in the Venetian Parc Community Clubhouse Meeting Room located at 15351 SW 175th Street, Miami, Florida 33187.

B. PROOF OF PUBLICATION

Ms. Nguyen presented proof of publication that notice of the May 31, 2023, Special Board Meeting had been published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on May 11, 2023, and May 18, 2023, *as legally required*.

C. ESTABLISH A QUORUM

Ms. Nguyen determined that the attendance of Chairman Eugene Collings-Bonfill, Vice Chairwoman Rachel Hernandez and Supervisor Ronald Fajardo constituted a quorum and it was in order to proceed with the meeting.

Staff in attendance included: District Manager Nancy Nguyen of Special District Services, Inc.; and District Counsel, Ginger Wald of Billing, Cochran, Lyles, Mauro & Ramsey, P.A.

Also in attendance was Carlos Dominguez, Miami, FL.

D. ADDITIONS OR DELETIONS TO AGENDA

Mr. Carlos Dominguez requested to have a discussion regarding “Children at Play” signs discussion added to the agenda. Ms. Nguyen stated that she would like to add the following item to the agenda.

- New Business Item 3. – Discussion Regarding Children at Play Signs

The Board acknowledged Ms. Nguyen’s request.

H. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

There were no comments from the public for items not on the agenda.

I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. February 23, 2023, Regular Board Meeting

Ms. Nguyen presented the minutes of the February 23, 2023, Regular Board Meeting and asked if there were any changes and/or corrections. There being no comments or changes, a **motion** was made by Mr. Fajardo, seconded by Mr. Collings-Bonfill and passed unanimously approving the minutes of the February 23, 2023, Regular Board Meeting, *as presented*.

NOTE: At approximately 8:55 p.m., Ms. Nguyen recessed the Special Meeting and simultaneously opened the Public Hearing.

J. PUBLIC HEARING

1. Proof of Publication

Ms. Nguyen presented proof of publication that notice of the Public Hearing had been published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on May 11, 2023, and May 18, 2023, as legally required.

2. Receive Public Comments on Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Final Budget

Ms. Nguyen opened the public comment portion of the Public Hearing to receive comments on the 2023/2024 fiscal year final budget and non-ad valorem special assessments. There being no comments, Ms. Nguyen closed the public comment portion of the Public Hearing.

3. Consider Resolution No. 2023-03 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Final Budget

Ms. Nguyen presented Resolution No. 2023-03, entitled:

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE VENETIAN PARC COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT APPROVING AND ADOPTING A FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024 FINAL BUDGET INCLUDING NON-AD VALOREM SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Ms. Nguyen stated that the document provides for approving and adopting the fiscal year 2023/2024 final budget and the non-ad valorem special assessment tax roll. A discussion ensued after which:

A **motion** was made by Mr. Fajardo, seconded by Mr. Collings-Bonfill and unanimously passed to approve and adopt Resolution No. 2023-03, *as presented*; thereby setting the 2023/2024 final budget and non-ad valorem special assessment tax roll.

NOTE: At approximately 6:57 p.m., Ms. Nguyen closed the Public Hearing and simultaneously reconvened the Special Meeting.

K. OLD BUSINESS

1. Update Regarding Tree Root Pruning/Tree Relocation

Ms. Nguyen provided an update regarding the progress of the tree removal and replanting project, stating that the first phase, involving the cutting of trees, has been successfully completed. She further explained that the next phase of the project will entail stump grinding and tree planting. The schedule of tree planting will be determined based on the delivery of the trees. Ms. Nguyen informed the Board that she will continue to work with the Venetian Parc Homeowners Association to provide updates to the residents.

2. Discussion Regarding Existing Driveway Extensions

Ms. Nguyen reminded the Board that during the February 23, 2023 Regular Board Meeting, the Board elected Miller, Legg and Associates, Inc. (Miller, Legg) as the District Engineer. As such, the Board requested that the District Manager request a proposal from Miller, Legg for an inspection of the driveways extensions throughout the District. The purpose of the inspection is to determine if the driveway extensions are posing an issue on the functioning of the stormwater system, sidewalks, curbs and gutters, or vehicular lanes in the right of way.

Ms. Nguyen further explained that Miller, Legg and Alvarez Engineers were finalizing the transfer of District documents and once that process is complete, Miller, Legg will be able to provide the District with a proposal. A discussion ensued, after which:

A **motion** was made by Mr. Collings-Bonfill, seconded by Mr. Fajardo and unanimously passed authorizing the District Manager to accept a proposal from Miller, Legg and Associates, Inc. for an inspection of the driveway extensions for an amount not to exceed \$8,660.

3. Discussion Regarding Stop Signs at Intersection of SW 175th Street & SW 153rd Avenue

Ms. Nguyen reported that after many requests, Miami-Dade County (the “County”) has installed stop signs at the intersection of SW 175th Street and SW 153rd Avenue. Ms. Nguyen further explained that the County initially installed the stop signs on the left side of the right of way. Ms. Nguyen informed the Board that Mr. Hernandez contacted the County, the Commissioner, and many other representatives to have the County install stop signs on the right side of the right of way. Ms. Nguyen stated that the County has since installed stop signs on the right side of the right of way and kept the signs on the left side as supplemental signs. Ms. Nguyen and the Board thanked Ms. Hernandez for her efforts.

Ms. Nguyen explained that she has requested that the County add stop bars on these roads. More information on this item will be provided at a future meeting.

L. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider Resolution No. 2023-04 – Adopting a Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Meeting Schedule

Ms. Nguyen presented Resolution No. 2023-04, entitled:

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE VENETIAN PARC COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, ESTABLISHING A REGULAR MEETING SCHEDULE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023/2024 AND SETTING THE TIME AND LOCATION OF SAID DISTRICT MEETINGS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Ms. Nguyen provided an explanation for the document. A discussion ensued after which:

A **motion** was made by Ms. Hernandez, seconded by Mr. Fajardo and unanimously passed to approve and adopt Resolution No. 2023-04, *as presented*; thereby setting the 2023/2024 regular meeting schedule and authorizing the publication of the annual meeting schedule, as required by law.

2. Consider Appointment of Audit Committee & Approval of Evaluation Criteria

Ms. Nguyen stated that an audit was required for the District’s fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, and it would be in order for the Board of Supervisors (the “Board”) to appoint an Audit Committee to commence the auditor selection process pursuant to 218.391, *Florida Statutes*.

A **motion** was made by Mr. Fajardo, seconded by Mr. Collings-Bonfill and unanimously passed to appoint the Board as the Audit Committee.

At approximately 7:09 p.m., Ms. Nguyen recessed the Special Board Meeting and simultaneously called to order a meeting of the Audit Committee to review and approve criteria for selection of an auditor and to authorize advertising for request for proposals. Ms. Nguyen presented the selection criteria information and an outline of material for the Request for Audit Proposals for the District. A discussion ensued after which:

A **motion** was made by Ms. Hernandez, seconded by Mr. Collings-Bonfill and unanimously passed to approve the criteria for the selection of an auditor, as presented, and instructed the District Manager to proceed, as required, to advertise for requests for proposals (“RFP”) for the fiscal years ending September 30, 2023, 2024 and 2025; and to include in the proposal package an **option** for an additional 2-year renewal (2026 and 2027).

There being no further business to conduct at this time by the Audit Committee, Ms. Nguyen adjourned the Audit Committee Meeting and simultaneously reconvened the Special Board Meeting of the District at approximately 7:10 p.m.

Ms. Nguyen stated that it would be appropriate for the Board to accept the actions of the Audit Committee as outlined herein above. A discussion ensued after which;

A **motion** was made by Mr. Collings-Bonfill, seconded by Mr. Fajardo and unanimously passed to accept the actions of the Audit Committee.

3. ADD-ON: Discussion Regarding Children at Play Signs

Ms. Nguyen extended an invitation to Mr. Carlos Dominguez to address the Board regarding the placement of “Children at Play” signs on his block. Mr. Dominguez explained that he puts the sign in the middle of the right of way when children from his block are out playing, with the intention of reminding motorists to exercise caution. He clarified that the signs do not obstruct the right of way and do not impede the flow of traffic. Mr. Dominguez informed the Board that an incident occurred where someone reported the sign Miami-Dade County Police. However, upon their arrival, the officers confirmed that there was no issue with the sign placement. Mr. Dominguez expressed his desire for written documentation from the District that he can present to authorities or individuals who question the presence of the sign. A discussion ensued, after which:

It was determined that the Board is unable to place any signage on the right of way, but there are perhaps other possibilities to alert motorists that there are children in the area.

A motion was made by Mr. Collings-Bonfill, seconded by Ms. Hernandez and unanimously passed to instruct the District Engineer, Mille, Legg and Associates, Inc. to conduct a signage study.

M. ADMINISTRATIVE & OPERATIONAL MATTERS

1. Statement of Financial Interest 2022 Form 1 – Filing Deadline: July 1, 2023

Board members were reminded of the importance of completing and mailing to the Supervisor of Elections within the County of residency their individual 2022 Statement of Financial Interests Form 1. The deadline for submittal is July 1, 2023.

N. BOARD MEMBER & STAFF CLOSING COMMENTS

Ms. Nguyen stated that unless an emergency were to arise, the Board would not meet to meet again until October 26, 2023.

O. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, a **motion** was made by Mr. Fajardo, seconded by Mr. Collings-Bonfill and unanimously passed adjourning the Regular Board Meeting at approximately 7:26 p.m.

AUDIT APPROACH

Grau's Understanding of Work Product / Scope of Services:

Proposed segmentation of the engagement

Our approach to the audit engagement is a risk-based approach which integrates the best of traditional auditing techniques and a total systems concept to enable the team to conduct a more efficient and effective audit. The audit will be conducted in three phases, which are as follows:



Phase I - Preliminary Planning

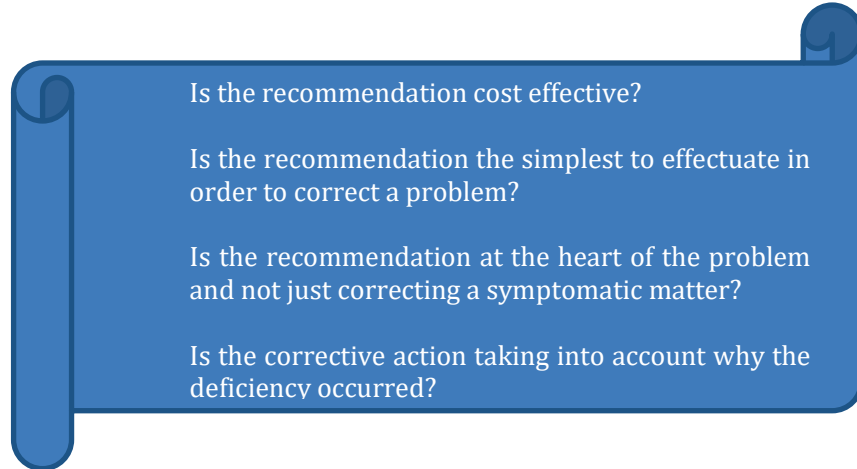
